



## **WASHINGTON 2016-17**

**VISUAL ARTS** include many art forms that are visual in nature. The *artist* (student submitting entry) is a person who captures their own thoughts and ideas to create a visual piece of art.

Reflection on the 2016-2017 Theme: What Is Your Story?

## **Submission Rules/Requirements:**

- Only new and original pieces of artwork inspired by the theme may be submitted.
- Each entry must be the work of one student only.
- Print MAY NOT exceed 18"x24" and 3/8" thickness, including matting.
- Entries may be created on paper, canvas board, cardboard, hot or cold pressboard, or cut canvas.
- Nothing three-dimensional (fabric, string, noodles, beans, beads, etc.) may move freely off the surface of a work.
- Entries should be mounted on foam core, sturdy cardboard, mat board, or some other rigid material.
- NO wood, metal, plastic, glass, or framed canvas.
- Entries should be mounted on foam core, sturdy cardboard, mat board, or some other rigid material.
- Mark proper orientation on back of entry.
- Protect entries with transparent cellophane wrap or sleeve designed for artwork. DO NOT laminate or use
  plastic food wrap. Shrinkwrap is not recommended, if used the student entry form MUST be attached outside
  of wrap.
- Student name should not be on the front of the entry (to help facilitate a blind judging).
- Label back of entry with your student name, title of artwork, category, grade division, PTA name and number.
- Original signed and completed student entry form should be securely affixed to the front of the re-closeable manila envelope in a sheet protector or plastic sleeve. Student entry form must be accessible. DO NOT use resealable bags (i.e. Ziplocs).

**Accepted forms of visual art include:** Collages, photographic collages (multiple photos cut/pasted), computergenerated image, design, drawing, painting, and printmaking.

An explanation of the art form might be a useful addition to the artist statement. Whether an entry displays use of formal technique or a simple approach, it will be judged primarily on how well the student uses his or her artistic vision to portray the theme, originality and creativity.

**Copyright:** Use of copyrighted material, including any copyrighted cartoon characters or likeness thereof, is not acceptable in any visual arts submission, with the following exceptions:

- Visual artwork may include public places, well-known products, trademarks or certain other copyrighted
  material as long as that copyrighted material is incidental to the subject matter of the piece and/or is a smaller
  element of a whole. The resulting work cannot try to establish an association between the student and the
  trademark/business/material, or influence the purchase/non-purchase of the trademarked good.
- Visual arts collages may include portions of existing copyrighted works, such as photographs, magazine clippings, internet images and type cut out of a newspaper, as long as those portions of copyrighted works are used to create a completely new and different work of art.
